



Karel Janeček is a Czech anti-corruption activist, mathematician and social reformer. Educated in the Czech Republic and in the United States, he founded a company, RSJ, which has become one of the most successful market makers in derivatives exchanges worldwide. He currently devotes his time to promoting accountable government through citizen action and electoral reform called Democracy 2.1 (D21) and further intensely supports for scientific research and anti-corruption. D21 can be used not only in politics but for any situation where people make decisions out of more options - for example in participatory budgeting, where community members directly decide how to spend part of a public budget. D21 is now at the center of a network of pilot projects that include cities in China, Tunisia and Portugal, as well as 28 neighborhoods in New York City. Dozens of Czech towns use multiple voting schemes of D21.
